Curriculum

The curriculum here in Newport College adapts to meet the students needs and desires. We offer a diverse range of subjects to Higher Level for Junior Cycle and Senior Cycle.

Junior Cycle Curriculum

First Year students in Newport College will study all of the core subjects and try out their option subjects during their first year.

After 12 weeks they will choose three optional subjects to study with their

core subjects for their Junior Cycle programme. Science, Business Studies and History are core subjects along with English, Irish and Maths. Students are surveyed on their subject choice at the end of November.

Every opportunity is taken to ensure student preference is met resulting in the highest possible satisfaction rating.



Digital Learning

Digital technologies have increasingly become part of everyday life in our modern society. At Newport College we recognise and appreciate the value technology plays in teaching, learning and assessment. We endeavour to develop a variety of digital skills and empower our learners to become digitally aware.

Microsoft Office is the online learning platform used in our school to support

student learning. Each student is provided with an Office 365 account. This online platform provides students with a variety of apps to support their learning inside and outside of the classroom. Students will learn a set of skills and applications that will support their work throughout 2nd level and beyond. Teachers and students can communicate through Outlook and collaborate via MSTeams. Transition Year



Newport College holds an annual school show in which all students are encouraged to participate in. These

shows incorporate diverse talents from across the school community and will often feature solo acts, rock bands, traditional Irish music, singing, choir, drama, dance and more. This is a stage where students can perform new songs, act in plays that they have written themselves and to perform with students from other year groups that they wouldn't normally have time to do so

School graduations, Seachtain na Gaeilge, other ceremonies and in particular the school open night are other opportunities for our students to showcase their hard work and talent. Many hours of work will go into rehearsals for special occasions like these: any excuse to develop and grow as musicians and we'll be there.



Our music teacher Mr. Cunniffe has a great love for all things traditional lrish music and has consistently led the school's traditional group to new heights with his arrangements and

new compositions. The group have performed at Newport Tradfest and regularly at the TETB Talent showcase. The aim is to emulate groups such as Lunasa, Beoga, Danú and many more. The 'trad ensemble' meet every week at lunch time and more regularly in the lead up to any event. The ensemble is open to all students who want to be part of the ensemble, not just traditional instruments or traditional musicians. Think of it more like an orchestra, much more like a grúpa ceoil you might see at a Fleadh.

The ukulele club meet once a week. It is an inclusive and social space where students who study music in the school and students who have an interest in ukulele can meet and play. Over the years the music room has always been a hive activity during breaks lunchtimes for students to come to express their talents. There is always something for everyone. It is so important to nourish people's musical abilities. Music is something that we can all take part in at any age and being involved in music can positively affect ones academic, physical and mental wellbeing.

Music Generation Tipperary have established a hub in our school, this further allows our students to garnish a love of music.

Student Leadership

Newport College has a strong tradition of Student Leadership and promotes and encourages student involvement in a number of programmes.

Student Council: The Student Council are elected by their peers to represent their year group. Students are given an opportunity to voice their ideas and opinions and debate issues of concern to them. They meet regularly and develop long and short term targets for the academic year.

Head Boy and Head Girl:

A senior male and female student are elected by their peers to represent the group and the school. These students meet regularly with school management to discuss student issues.

The Mentoring Programme:

This is a peer mentoring programme whereby Transition Year students are paired with a First Year student. This helps students to settle into life in Newport College and make the transition easier for new students. A number of activities are organised throughout the year. Senior students gain valuable experience in leadership skills through this programme.







Pastoral Care

This is an area of great importance in Newport College as we strive to fulfill our school motto of: 'Every Child Matters'. We endeavour to create a school community where students feel safe, valued, respected, and that they belong.

Pastoral Care in our school strives to support students in a variety of areas: the transition from primary to secondary school, secondary to tertiary education. exam pressure, relationships, personal development.

Year Head and Tutor:

Each year group has a designated Year Head and class tutor who look after and look out for each student in their group. Year Heads liaise with parents and staff to ensure that students needs are being met.

Study Skills, Supervised Study, Homework Club:

Each year, study skills workshops are organised for students.

Supervised Study runs Monday to Thursday from 4pm to 6pm and Friday from 1:30pm to 3:30pm for students who wish to avail of it.

Homework Club runs during the year for junior students.

Special Educational Needs Team/ Learning Support: The SEN coordinator and SEN team meet regularly to develop Student Support Plans for students, develop strategies for students and teachers to support student learning in conjunction with parents, students and staff. Team teaching is in place to support student learning.

Guidance and Counselling:

Guidance Counsellor a pivotal role in our school. Our aim is to assist all students in their holistic development while providing educational, vocational and personal guidance. This is done through the implementation of the school Guidance Programme.



This programme in place has been developed to suit the needs of our students as they progress through each stage of their educational journey. The Guidance Counsellor offers one-to-one support to students who want to discuss personal or vocational issues in a confidential, non-judgemental setting. This can be at the request of the student or by referral from a staff member or parent.





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
